Ansgar Strother, co-Founder & CEO: Ansgar Strother is a graduate of the University of Michigan with a degree in Computer Engineering. After graduating in December of 2013, Ansgar turned down a full-time offer from Microsoft and began working on the start-up company he founded in college A2B Bikeshare. He was the founder and CEO from June 2012 - December 2016. A2B Bikeshare was a bike share hardware company that removed the need for expensive kiosks. While leading A2B Bikeshare the company raised a pre-seed round and entered into a major partnership with Republic Bikes. In fall of 2016 Ansgar led the licensing of A2B Bikeshare's technology to several companies including Motivate, the largest bike-sharing operator in the USA. This success was followed by Zagster acquiring the company's assets in early 2017. After the sale of A2B Bikeshare's technology Ansgar started Movatic to address software mobility pain points seen at A2B Bikeshare with 5 years of start-up and mobility experience. 3 Year Work History: Movatic, CEO, Jan 2017 - Present A2B Bikeshare, CEO, 2012-2016

Business and Anticipated Business Plan

6. Describe in detail the business of the issuer and the anticipated business plan of the issuer.

Sales of shareable bikes by OEMs and bike parking have been growing rapidly around the globe, while the traditional individual ownership model has stalled. These trends have pushed several of the largest bike manufacturers to create proprietary bike sharing systems. The roughly 200 small-mid sized bike OEMs and 100 bike parking OEMs have been left out of this market due to a lack of in-house resources to develop and maintain the software required (smartphone based reservation, rental, payment, and admin management site) to enter this market segment. To stay competitive and continue to grow these OEMs realize that they will need to find a way to enter the sharing market. Our Solution: Movatic has solved this problem by creating a flexible shared mobility software platform that allows small-mid sized OEM's to access this growing sharing market with minimum

investment. Movatic has developed a comprehensive software platform that will operate with any bike, bike locker or scooter product. This flexibility is a marked departure from existing specialized software that is dedicated for use with specific hardware. OEMs package the Movatic software platform with their hardware to sell a complete turn-key package to shared /on-demand systems operators. These operators in turn manage the system for use by individual riders. Movatic's cloud-based administration website allows operators to efficiently operate their systems with a single tool. An efficient operation is achieved through reservation, billing, real-time data and reports. Renters can use the Movatic app to get real-time bike availability, instantly unlock and rent, and seamlessly pay. Moving forward we plan to work on adding automated maintenance (contracts out the repair to a 3rd party automatically) of hardware (bikes, lockers) and on-demand insurance purchase.

7. Material factors that make an investment in Movatic, Inc. speculative or risky:

1. While Movatic is break even and growing rapidly it is still a startup working in a very rapidly changing marketplace. Investing in startups is very risky, highly speculative, and should not be made by anyone who cannot afford to lose their entire investment. Unlike an investment in a mature business where there is a track record of revenue and income, the success of a startup or early-stage venture often relies on the development of a new product or service that may or may not find a market. We may run out of money before we can execute our business plan. Before investing, you should carefully consider the specific risks and disclosures related to both this offering type and the company.
2. We operate in an emerging market that is characterized by rapid changes in customer requirements, frequent introductions of new and enhanced products, and continuing and rapid technological advancement. Our technology may under perform the technology utilized by our competitors.
3. We are highly dependent on the Services of our founder. Our future business and results of operations depend in significant part upon the continued contributions of our CEO and founder. If we lose those services or if he fails to perform in his current position, or if we are not able to attract and retain skilled employees in addition to our CEO and the current team, this could adversely affect the development of our business plan and harm our business. In addition, the loss of any other executive officers could harm the Company's business, financial condition, cash flow and results of operations.
4. We have a limited operating history upon which investors may base an evaluation of our potential future performance. In particular, we have not proven that we can develop and maintain relationships with key vendors and strategic partners to extract value from our

intellectual property, raise sufficient capital in the public and/or private markets, or respond effectively to competitive pressures. As a result, there can be no assurance that we will be able to develop or maintain consistent revenue sources, or that our operations will be profitable.

5. Any valuation at this stage is difficult to assess. Unlike listed companies that are valued publicly through market-driven stock prices, the valuation of private companies, especially startups, is difficult to assess and you may risk overpaying for your investment. In addition, there may be additional classes of equity with rights that are superior to the class of equity being sold.
6. We are subject to the data privacy and protection laws and regulations adopted by federal, state and foreign governmental agencies. Data privacy and protection is highly regulated and may become the subject of additional regulation in the future. Privacy laws restrict our storage, use, processing, disclosure, transfer and protection of personal information, including credit card data, provided to us by our customers as well as data we collect from our customers and employees. We strive to comply with all applicable laws, regulations, policies and legal obligations relating to privacy and data protection. However, it is possible that these requirements may be interpreted and applied in a manner that is inconsistent from one jurisdiction to another and may conflict with other rules or our practices. Should this occur, we may be subject to fines, penalties and lawsuits, and our reputation may suffer. We may also be required to make modifications to our data practices that could have an adverse impact on our business.
7. Intense competition in the markets in which we compete could prevent us from generating or sustaining revenue growth and generating or maintaining profitability.
8. Our future growth depends to a large extent on our ability to effectively anticipate and adapt to customer requirements and offer services that meet customer demands. If we are unable to attract customers and/or retain customers, our business, results of operations and financial condition may be materially adversely affected.
9. Any forecasts we make about our operations may prove to be inaccurate. We must, among other things, determine appropriate risks, rewards, and level of investment in our product lines, respond to economic and market variables outside of our control, respond to competitive developments and continue to attract, retain, and motivate qualified employees. There can be no assurance that we will be successful in meeting these challenges and addressing such risks and the failure to do so could have a materially adverse effect on our business, results of operations, and financial condition. Our prospects must be considered in light of the risks, expenses, and difficulties frequently encountered by companies in the early stage of development. As a result of these risks, challenges, and uncertainties, the value of your investment could be significantly reduced or completely lost.
10. We may conduct future offerings of our common stock and pay debt obligations with newly issued common stock, which may diminish our investors' pro rata ownership.
11. Intense competition in the markets in which we compete could prevent us from generating or sustaining revenue growth and generating or maintaining profitability. We expect it to become increasingly competitive in the future as more startups enter the industry. We may also face competition from large companies, any of which might have more capital than we have, and launch its own business that competes with us.

The Offering

Movatic, Inc. ("Company") is offering securities under Regulation CF, through Netcapital Funding Portal Inc. ("Portal"). Portal is a FINRA/SEC registered funding portal and will receive cash compensation equal to 4.9% of the value of the securities sold through Regulation CF. Investments made under Regulation CF involve a high degree of risk and those investors who cannot afford to lose their entire investment should not invest.

The Company plans to raise between \$10,000 and \$91,000 through an offering under Regulation CF. Specifically, if we reach the target offering amount of \$10,000, we may conduct the first of multiple or rolling closings of the offering early if we provide notice about the new offering deadline at least five business days prior to such new offering deadline (absent a material change that would require an

extension of the offering and reconfirmation of the investment commitment). Oversubscriptions will be allocated on a first come, first served basis. Changes to the offering, material or otherwise, occurring after a closing, will only impact investments which have yet to be closed.

In the event The Company fails to reach the offering target of \$10,000, any investments made under the offering will be cancelled and the investment funds will be returned to the investor.

8. What is the purpose of this offering?

We expect the funding to be used to accelerate Movatic's growth. This might be done in 2 ways: increasing sales and marketing efforts and platform development to be able to support more potential customers.

10. How will the issuer complete the transaction and deliver securities to the investors?

In entering into an agreement on the Netcapital Funding Portal to purchase securities, both investors and Movatic, Inc. must agree that a transfer agent, which keeps records of our outstanding Common Stock (the "Securities"), will issue digital Securities in the investor's name (a paper certificate will not be printed). Similar to other online investment accounts, the transfer agent will give investors access to a web site to see the number of Securities that they own in our company. These Securities will be issued to investors after the deadline date for investing has passed, as long as the targeted offering amount has been reached. The transfer agent will record the issuance when we have received the purchase proceeds from the escrow agent who is holding your investment commitment.

11. How can an investor cancel an investment commitment?

You may cancel an investment commitment for any reason until 48 hours prior to the deadline identified in the offering by logging in to your account with Netcapital, browsing to the Investments screen, and clicking to cancel your investment commitment. Netcapital will notify investors when the target offering amount has been met. If the issuer reaches the target offering amount prior to the deadline identified in the offering materials, it may close the offering early if it provides notice about the new offering deadline at least five business days prior to such new offering deadline (absent a material change that would require an extension of the offering and reconfirmation of the investment commitment). If an investor does not cancel an investment commitment before the 48-hour period prior to the offering deadline, the funds will be released to the issuer upon closing of the offering and the investor will receive securities in exchange for his or her investment. If an investor does not reconfirm his or her investment commitment after a material change is made to the offering, the investor's investment commitment will be cancelled and the committed funds will be returned.

12. Can the Company perform multiple closings or rolling closings for the offering?

If we reach the target offering amount prior to the offering deadline, we may conduct the first of multiple closings of the offering early, if we provide notice about the new offering deadline at least five business days prior (absent a material change that would require an extension of the offering and reconfirmation of the investment commitment). Thereafter, we may conduct additional closings until the offering deadline. We will issue Securities in connection with each closing. Oversubscriptions will be allocated on a first come, first served basis. Changes to the offering, material or otherwise, occurring after a closing, will only impact investments which have yet to be closed.

Ownership and Capital Structure

The Offering

13. Describe the terms of the securities being offered.

We are issuing Securities at an offering price of \$2.50 per share.

14. Do the securities offered have voting rights?

The Securities are being issued with voting rights. However, so that the crowdfunding community has the opportunity to act together and cast a vote as a group when a voting matter arises, a custodian will cast your vote for you. Please refer to the custodian agreement that you sign before your purchase is complete.

15. Are there any limitations on any voting or other rights identified above?

You are giving your voting rights to the custodian, who will vote the Securities on behalf of all investors who purchased Securities on the Netcapital crowdfunding portal.

16. How may the terms of the securities being offered be modified?

We may choose to modify the terms of the securities before the offering is completed. However, if the terms are modified, and we deem it to be a material change, we need to contact you and you will be given the opportunity to reconfirm your investment. Your reconfirmation must be completed within five business days of receipt of the notice of a material change, and if you do not reconfirm, your investment will be canceled and your money will be returned to you.

Restrictions on Transfer of the Securities Offered

The securities being offered may not be transferred by any purchaser of such securities during the one-year period beginning when the securities were issued, unless such securities are transferred:

- to the issuer;
- to an accredited investor;
- as part of an offering registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission; or

The term “spousal equivalent” means a cohabitant occupying a relationship generally equivalent to that of a spouse.

18. **How may the rights of the securities being offered be materially limited, diluted or qualified by the rights of any other class of securities?**

Movatic may seek to raise additional capital in the future, this could dilute current shareholders, including investors who participate in this offering. Although we have reserved shares for an option pool, no stock options currently exist. The holder of a majority of the voting rights in the company may make decisions with which you disagree, or that negatively affect the value of your investment in the company, and you will have no recourse to change those decisions. Your interests may conflict with the interests of other investors, and there is no guarantee that the company will develop in a way that is advantageous to you. For example, the majority shareholder may decide to issue additional shares to new investors, sell convertible debt instruments with beneficial conversion features, or make decisions that affect the tax treatment of the company in ways that may be unfavorable to you. Based on the risks described above, you may lose all or part of your investment in the securities that you purchase, and you may never see positive returns.

As minority owners, the crowdfunding investors are subject to the decisions made by the majority owners. The issued and outstanding shares of common stock give management voting control of the company. No other class of stock has been authorized. An authorization for a new class of stock would require action by the board of Directors.

As minority owners, the crowdfunding investors are subject to the decisions made by the management team or the majority shareholders. There is a risk that the majority shareholder exercises his voting rights in a manner that is not favorable to the interest of individuals who are minority owners.

The issuance of additional securities will dilute the ownership of the crowdfunding investors. As a result, if we achieve profitable operations in the future, our net income per share will be reduced because of dilution, and the market price of our common stock, if there is a market price, could decline as a result of the additional issuances of securities. If we repurchase securities, so that the above risk is mitigated, we may not have enough cash available for marketing expenses, growth, or operating expenses to reach our goals. If we do not have enough cash to operate and grow, we anticipate the market price of our common stock, if any, would decline. A sale of our company or of all the assets of our company may result in an entire loss of your investment. We cannot predict the market value of our company or our assets, and the proceeds of a sale may not be cash, but instead, unmarketable securities, or an assumption of liabilities. It is unlikely that in the near term, a sale would result in a premium that is significant enough over book value to generate a return to our investors. We may need to negotiate with a related party for additional capital. No assurance can be given that such funds will be available or, if available, will be on commercially reasonable terms satisfactory to us. We anticipate that if we have any transactions with related parties, that they will be on an arms-length basis.

Financial Condition of the Issuer

27. Does the issuer have an operating history?

Yes.

28. Describe the financial condition of the issuer, including, to the extent material, liquidity, capital resources and historical results of operations.

The company has no debt and is operating at a break even level. For the period from inception at August 12, 2016 to December 31, 2016, cash provided by operating activities amounted to \$7,684. For the year ended December 31, 2017, cash provided by operating activities amounted to \$862. For the year ended December 31, 2017, revenues amounted to \$152,381, an increase of \$133,881 over the \$185,00 in revenues for the period from inception at August 12, 2016 to December 31, 2016. Expenses rose in the year ended December 31, 2017, to \$131,135, as compared to \$10,454 in the prior period. The majority of the expenses in 2017 were \$97,121 for software development and \$25,500 for sales contracting. Overall, we incurred a net loss of \$240 in the year ended December 31, 2017, as compared to net income of \$8,046 in the prior year period. We do not have significant sources of capital available to us at this time, and we are seeking up to \$107,000 in this offering for additional product development and marketing expense. Although we originally formed as a Michigan limited liability company, effective January 18, 2018, the Company redomiciled from Michigan to Delaware and incorporated, being Movatic, Inc., a Delaware corporation. Movatic's 2018 revenue will be similar to 2017 revenue numbers as we have worked on bringing on several major accounts that will not produce significant revenue until 2019. Movatic has been spending roughly an additional \$5,000 beyond revenue to invest in platform improvements to be able to bring on new accounts. Our current expenses are roughly \$15,000 a month which represents roughly \$10,000 worth of investment in platform improvements for growth and \$5,000 in operational expenses. The share price of \$2.50 is well within standard pre-seed round evaluations. The 25% increase since our last raise reflexes the improvements we have made on the business and technical side since our last raise.
