We set out to build a bike that would be perfectly sized for the vast majority of the riding we love to do. Janus Motorcycles are designed to give the rider as much thrill as possible in their everyday riding.

They are a joy to ride—we hear it time and time again. Depending on if it is a 250 or 450, all our models weigh between 265 and 350 pounds, which, paired with our peppy, bullet-proof engines makes for a great power-to-weight ratio.

Lightweight motorcycling is a completely different philosophy than what most of the industry ascribes to. But going 60 on a lightweight, agile motorcycle feels as fast as much higher speeds on much bigger bikes... and provides an opportunity for more joy in your everyday joy-riding.
